**Gerald A. (Jerry) McBeath** is Emeritus Professor of Political Science at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, where he has worked since 1976. He studied at the University of Chicago (AB, 1963; AM, 1964) and the University of California at Berkeley (PhD, Political Science, 1970). His research interests include studies of China and Taiwan's domestic and foreign politics, US state, local and national government and politics, federalism and the politics of the Arctic; and environmental politics and policy, both domestic and foreign. He and Jenifer wrote Chapters 1, 2, 6, 7, 10 and most of Chapters 8, 9 and 11.

**Jenifer Huang McBeath** is Professor of Plant Pathology and Biotechnology at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, where she has conducted research and service since 1977. She studied at National Taiwan University (BS, 1965), University of California at Davis (MS, 1970), and Rutgers University (PhD in plant pathology, 1974). Her research interests include plant diseases, plant-microbial interactions, disease diagnostics, dissemination and diversity of plant pathogens, biological control of plant diseases, environmental change, and food security in both China and the Arctic. Her concern for protecting the environment and human health resulted in the discovery and development of 'Cold Tolerant *Trichoderma*' (*Trichoderma atroviride*), a versatile biological control agent with a strong adaptive ability to the cold.

**Tian Qing** is Associate Professor of Education at the Environmental Education Center, Beijing Normal University, where she has worked since 1998. She studied at Beijing Normal University, where she gained a BSc degree in physical geography (1992), Master's in education (environmental education, 1998), and PhD in physical geography (Human Adaptation to Climate Change, 2005). Her research areas include environmental education and education for sustainable development, human adaptation to climate change, education for sustainable consumption, education for disaster prevention, and geography education. She wrote Chapters 3 and 5 and contributed to Chapters 8 and 11.

**Huang Yu** is Associate Professor of Geography at Beijing Normal University, where he has worked since 1997. He studied at Beijing

Normal University, where he gained both a BS and MS in geography (1994, 1997) and a PhD in education (2003).
